## PART 1 — MEMBERS

This by-law relates to rule 12 of the constitution of the Cockburn Basketball Association and is in accordance with the provisions of the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (Western Australia) and the Liquor Control Act 1988.

### Division 1 — Classes of Associate Membership

#### 1. Associate Member

- (1) Any person over the age of 18 who supports the objects or purposes of the Association is eligible to apply to become an associate member.
- (2) A salaried employee of the Association is eligible to apply for a class of associate membership
- (3) An individual who has not reached the age of 18 years can only be a junior member.

#### 2. Association Life Member

- (1) A person who has been granted life membership of the association automatically becomes an associate member for life.
- (2) A life member has the same rights and privileges as an associate member but is entitled to apply for ordinary membership without any obligation to make payment of any membership fee.

#### 3. Cougar Life Member

- (1) A Cougar player who has attained a Cougar Life Membership as a result of playing 200 games for the Cougars in the State Basketball League automatically becomes an associate member.
- (2) A Cougar life member has the same rights and privileges as an associate member but is entitled to apply for ordinary membership without any obligation to make payment of any membership fee.

#### 4. Junior Member

- (1) An association registered player who has not reached the age of 18 years is considered to be a junior member of the association without any obligation to make payment of any membership fee.
- (2) Subject to sub-rule 1, on attaining the age of 18 years a junior member may apply for associate membership.

## 5. Social Member

- (1) Any person not involved in participation of basketball at the Cockburn Basketball Association may apply to become a social member to allow that person to avail themselves of the benefits of associate members. For the purpose of the Liquor Control Act 1988, a social member shall have the same status as an associate member.
- (2) A social member is required to pay the fee applicable to associate membership.

## 6. Temporary Member

- (1) A person who is on any day, visiting the premises of the association as a member, an official or a person assisting a team that is to contest a pre-arranged basketball game, or at the invitation of a member to participate in a game of basketball that day, or be a sponsor of the association or the guest of a sponsor may for the purpose of the Liquor Control Act 1988, but for no other purpose, be given the status of an associate member for that day.
- (2) A temporary member will not be charged a membership fee.
